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## USDA extends comment period for proposed SNAP rule

Due to technical difficulties, the USDA is reopening the comment period for the proposed Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) rule from April 8 through April 10.

As a reminder, the proposed harsh changes would take away food assistance from the communities that need it most, including American Indian and Alaska Native communities who rely on SNAP each month to put food on the table. By USDA's own estimates, the proposal would eliminate SNAP benefits for 755,000 Americans and cut SNAP funding by \$15 billion over 10 years.
