### TTAC Application Information

The Department of Treasury (Treasury) will host a conference call on Tuesday, April 2, 2015 to engage with tribal leaders regarding applications and recommendations for appointments by the Secretary of Treasury (Secretary) to the newly created Treasury Tribal Advisory Committee (TTAC).

Treasury is seeking input on criteria the Secretary should consider when selecting appointees. For example, should the three candidates selected by the Treasury:

- Represent diverse regions?
- Have a firm tax and finance background?
- Have a special skill set?
- Have experience working in Indian Country?
- Have an acute understanding of Indian issues, laws, and history?

In addition to considering selection criteria, input may be helpful that clearly states which of any

#### **About TTAC**

The Tribal General Welfare Exclusion Act of 2014 (P.L. 113-168) was signed into law by the President last September and requires the establishment of the TTAC. Through the enactment of the TTAC Charter, the Treasury has announced a call for nominations for committee members. The TTAC will be made up of seven representatives with the Treasury selecting three members of the TTAC and Congress selecting the remaining four members. The TTAC is an open advisory committee that is subject to the Federal Advisory Committee Act. The committee members have a broad mandate to "advise the Secretary on matters relating to the taxation of Indians".
