2016 TBA	President of the General Assembly Consultations – New York	The President of the General Assembly will conduct consultations with member states, indigenous peoples' representatives and institutions, and UN mechanisms, on steps to enable the participation of indigenous peoples' representatives and institutions in UN meetings. The President will prepare a compilation of views presented during the consultations. The General Assembly is to finalize and adopt the text during its 71 st session (September 2016-September 2017). <u>A/70/486</u> .

June, 2016	Human Rights Council, 32 nd Session – Geneva	Council to consider the issue of violence against women and receive the reports of the Special Rapporteur on violence against women and of the Working Group on the issue of discrimination against women in law and in practice on its country visit to the United States. July, 2016	Expert Mechanism on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, 9 th Session – Geneva	Expert Mechanism to consider follow-up to the World Conference, including consideration of the report and recommendations of the Expert Workshop on the Review of the Expert Mechanism's mandate. <u>A/HRC/RES/30/11</u> . Specific meeting dates to be determined.
September , 2016	Human Rights Council, 33 rd Session – Geneva	Council to hold a half-day panel discussion on violence against indigenous women, its causes and consequences, <u>A/HRC/RES/30/4</u> ; consider the report and recommendations of the Expert Workshop on the Review of EMRIP, <u>A/HRC/RES/30/11</u> ; and adopt the annual resolution on human rights and indigenous peoples. Specific meeting dates to be determined.
September 13, 2016	General Assembly 71 st Session, opens – New York	GA to convene a high-level event to mark the 10 th anniversary of the adoption of the UN Declaration to be held during the 71 st session of the GA, in 2017. The event will take stock of the achievements of the preceding 10 years, assess remaining challenges for the rights of indigenous peoples, and consider the further follow-up to the Declaration (A/RES/69/159).
		GA to consider and decide the issue of participation of indigenous peoples' representatives and institutions in the UN during its 71 st session. <u>A/70/486</u> .
