## USET Resolution No. 2009:017

## SUPPORT OF THE CATAWBA INDIAN NATION

United South and Eastern Tribes Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprised of twenty-WHEREAS.

five (25) federally recognized Tribes; and

WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member Tribe,

as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member Tribes' leadership; and

the Catawba Indian Nation is a member of USET and has been a federally recognized Tribe since WHEREAS.

passage of the Catawba Indian Tribe of South Carolina Land Claims Settlement Act of 1993, which incorporated a Settlement Agreement between and among the United States and the State of South

Carolina and Congress; and

the Settlement Agreement reached between the United States, the State of South Carolina and the WHEREAS,

Catawba Indian Nation was concluded under great pressure and does not reflect the best interests of the

Catawba Indian Nation; and

the Settlement Agreement was intended to afford the Catawba Indian Nation the opportunity to develop a WHEREAS.

sound and self-sustaining economy, but actions by the State of South Carolina have undermined that

intent: and

evidence of the unfairness of the agreement and its implementation can be found in the failure of the WHEREAS.

Catawba Indian Nation's gaming operations and in the imposition of a fee on Catawba children attending

local public schools; and

the Catawba Indian Nation does not have the rights and responsibilities under Federal law commonly WHEREAS.

recognized for other Tribal Nations and, therefore, the Catawba essentially have a second-class form of

Tribal sovereignty; therefore,

be it

the USET Board of Directors strongly supports the Catawba Indian Nation in its efforts to petition the State RESOLVED

of South Carolina and the United States Government for a redress of these grievances through

amendment of Federal law, state law and the Settlement Agreement, as appropriate.
