The next consultation on how to enable the participation of indigenous peoples' representatives and institutions (governments) at the United Nations will take place on December 14-15 at UN Headquarters in New York City (in the Trusteeship Council room). Indigenous peoples' representatives and UN member states are invited to provide their views on how to enable such participation.

The deadline to register is Friday, December 9. Indigenous peoples' representatives and institutions that wish to participate at the consultation must send an email to indigenous un@un.org with the following initial information:

- 2. Name of the organization/tribe
- 3. Email address

There will be additional consultations at the UN in New York in 2017: January 30-February 1, February 27-28, and April 24-May 5. The results of these consultations are set to be finalized by the General Assembly before September, 2017, and will shape how indigenous governments will be able to participate at the UN for many years to come.

The focus of the consultations, at least initially, will be on the attached framework document which outlines the results of consultations held earlier this year. For your consideration, please also find attached an updated two-page memo by the Center on the issue, along with a more detailed paper submitted to inform the framework document in early 2016. The submission was filed with the support of a number of tribes and organizations.
