Hepatitis C Clinical Training

September 26-27, 2018 · Harrah's Cherokee, Cherokee, NC

Hepatitis C can be cured and our IHS, Tribal, and urban (I/T/U) Indian primary care clinics have the capacity to provide this cure.

A free training for I/T/U facilities to provide a range of HCV services at the primary care level will take place September 26-27 at Cherokee, NC.

The training will focus on the management and treatment of patients with hepatitis C. The 2-day training includes an opportunity to learn about the ECHO model of collaborative learning, present cases, receive recommendations from a specialist, engage in multiple didactic sessions, and become part of a learning community.

Learner Outcomes/Objectives:

- Recognize the importance of universal screening and universal treatment of Hepatitis C.
- Examine the epidemiology and prevalence of Hepatitis C in relation to Indian Country – with an emphasis on the Nashville Area.
- Apply the tools for management of care of HCV patients and how to implement them.
- Summarize best practices in HCV drug procurement processes in the Nashville Area.
- Describe the newest HCV antiviral treatments including indications and side effects.
- Apply processes for and develop policies for HCV screening and interpretation of results.
- Describe best practices for screening and treating of HCV in persons who inject drugs (PWID).
- Establish a teleconferencing consultation system for HCV positive patients utilizing the ECHO model.
