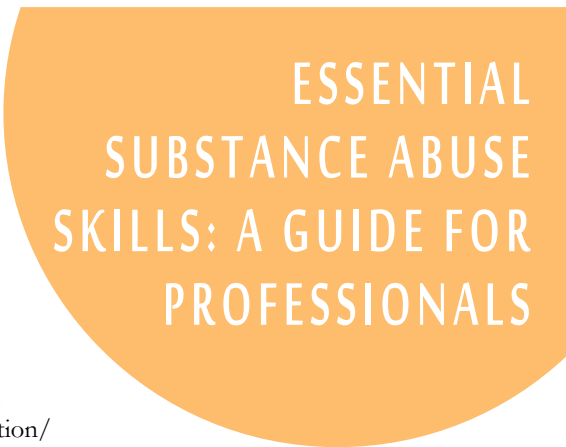


What is this series about?
