

TO: RECOGNIZE THE ROLE OF THE INDIAN COMMUNITY ACTION PROJECT ADVISORY BOARD

RESOLUTION NO. USET-9-69

WHEREAS: The United Southeastern Tribes have joined together to secure Training and Technical Assistance because we know that, in order to be responsible and productive members of society we must have experience in managing our own programs, and


WHEREAS: One of the most significant benefits from the Indian Community Action Project grant has been the opportunity for Indians of the Southeast to have experience in planning and operating programs which affect their common destiny, and


WHEREAS: The administrative structure and operating procedures of Atlanta University seem inconsistent with these stated objectives to the point that representatives of the United Southeastern Tribes deem it necessary to restate the original intention of the Indian Community Action Project for the Southeast, which is that the United Southeastern Tribes have the responsibility of directing this program, in order to afford the opportunity to Indian people to function in a role of responsibility;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the United Southeastern Tribes, in Quarterly Council assembled, recognize the Indian Community Action Project Advisory Board as the sole responsible authority for directing and controlling the program and its operating procedures;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That if it is impossible after a period of six months for the objectives of the United Southeastern Tribes to operate in harmony with the policies of the Atlanta University, the United Southeastern Tribes Advisory Board will seek other alternatives to obtain its objectives.

DONE THIS 16th DAY OF MAY, 1969, in Quarterly Council assembled, a quorum being present, with amendments made, at Nashville, Tennessee, by unanimous vote.
