A Resolution Supporting National Indian Health Board Resolution to Assure Availability of Health Care Personnel and Services

WHEREAS, United Southeastern Tribes agrees with and supports the National Indian Health Board's resolution that there have been unwarranted abuses of nurses, physicians, and other persons providing health care to American and Alaskan Native peoples based on unsubstantiated charges against them, and

WHEREAS, it is becoming increasingly difficult to attract and retain health professionals to work in our hospitals and clinics,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that United Southeastern Tribes, Inc., supports the National Indian Health Board in its resolution to advise the various health boards, tribes and organizations of the above mentioned situation and encourage them to continue to use reason, facts, and impartial examination before acting or reacting to a possible wrong or right, in an effort to continue to assure the availability of health care personnel and services.


