CETA, TITLE II


WHEREAS, Indian tribes in the Southeastern United States have suffered unusually high unemployment rates in recent years, and


WHEREAS, the allocation of Public Service Employment funds under Title II of the Comprehensive Employment & Training Act of 1973 provides insufficient funds to effectively deal with the magnitude of Indian unemployment in the Southeastern United States in that at most one qualified participant in each tribe can be hired,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the United Southeastern Tribes, Inc. be given special consideration for additional monies to deal with high unemployment in a manner which is consistent with the intent of CETA of 1973.

The foregoing resolution No. 74-21 was adopted at a regular meeting of the United Southeastern Tribes, Inc. legally and duly held at Sarasota, Florida on August 14-16, 1974.
