

UNITED SOUTH AND EASTERN TRIBES, INC.

RESOLUTION NO. 79-1

WHEREAS, the United South and Eastern Tribes is an inter-tribal council representing eight federally recognized American Indian Tribes in the South and Eastern United States, and

WHEREAS, the allocation of funds to provide sanitary sewer and water construction and renovation to tribal housing and tribal facilities is of the utmost importance to the United South and Eastern Tribes, and


WHEREAS, the President's 1980 budget does not provide any allocation to provide new or renovate existing sanitary sewer and water systems, thereby hampering the efforts to develop decent, safe and sanitary water and sewer systems.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of United South and Eastern Tribes, Inc. goes on record opposing the President's 1980 budget because it does not provide allocations for this necessary task, and


NOW BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Directors is asking the Congressional Delegations from each of the member Tribes states, take the necessary steps to provide special allocation of funding to the Indian Health Service budget for the instillation of new and renovation of existing sanitary sewer and water systems on the reservation.
