RESOLUTION #82-104




WHEREAS, there has been no official response from the Bureau to the questions posed in the initial concept paper presented to the Assistant Secretary, and


WHEREAS, conflicting information has been received from various levels of authority within the Bureau regarding what the Eastern Service Center will be and how the services will be provided; now


