

UNITED SOUTH AND EASTERN TRIBES, INC.

Resolution No. B-87-184

- WHEREAS United South & Eastern Tribes is an Inter-Tribal Council representing sixteen federally recognized Indian Tribes located in the Eastern part of the United States; and
- WHEREAS The Chitimacha Tribe of Louisiana is a member of the Inter-Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS The Chitimacha Tribe has recently suffered significant cuts in funding from the Bureau of Indian Affairs which will severely effect the Tribe's ability to operate its programs; and
- WHEREAS These cuts are a direct result of an innappropriate allocation formula utilized by the Bureau of Indian Affairs;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Directors of United South and Eastern Tribes supports the Tribe's request for supplemental funding, and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board calls upon the Bureau to reevaluate the allocation methodology now in place and seek direct input from tribes in establishing a more equitable formula.


CERTIFICATION
