SUPPORT FOR ISSUANCE OF A COMMEMORATIVE STAMP TO HONOR
THE 200TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CANANDAIGUA TREATY


- WHEREAS, the United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of 18 federally-recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, USET is committed to honoring and keeping alive the spirit of those forces and events which have shaped the lives of Native American people as a means of protecting our heritage; and
- WHEREAS, the 200th Anniversary of the Canandaigua Treaty occurs on November 11, 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Canandaigua Treaty represents a significant event to all Indian people as it established the lasting peace between the Six Nations of the Iroquois Confederacy and the United States government; and
- WHEREAS, the United States Postal Service regularly issues commemorative stamps to honor the memory of individuals, places, and events important to our nation's history,
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the USET Board write to the United States Postmaster General, the Honorable Anthony M. Frank, to request that a commemorative stamp be issued on November 11, 1994 to honor this historic treaty of peace between Indian people and the United States government.
