**Resolution No. 93-21DC**

**SUPPORT FOR A JUVENILE DETENTION CENTER TO BE LOCATED AT  
MISSISSIPPI BAND OF CHOCTAWS**

**WHEREAS,** the United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of twenty (20) federally recognized tribes; and

**WHEREAS,** the actions taken by the USET, Inc. Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors is comprised of delegates from the member tribes leadership; and

**WHEREAS,** the Indian Health Service and Bureau of Indian Affairs has signed a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to provide technical assistance to tribal programs in writing and implementing Tribal Action Plans (TAP) to address Alcohol/Substance Abuse; and

**WHEREAS,** the IHS/NAO has drafted an organizational management action plan based on the TAP's; and


**WHEREAS,** one objective of this organizational management action plan is the implementation of juvenile detention centers that provide for social detoxication of adolescents; and

**WHEREAS,** the Mississippi Band of Choctaw Indians have proposed for funding under the BIA Law Enforcement Program to be the site for the first BIA federally funded juvenile detention facility in the USET area.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the USET Board of Directors hereby support and endorse the Mississippi Band of Choctaw Indians proposal as a model site for the juvenile detention facility in the USET area.
