USET SPF Resolution No. 2022 SPF:001

SUPPORTING COMPACTING THE UNITY HEALING CENTER

WHEREAS,	United South and Eastern Tribes Sovereignty Protection Fund (USET SPF) is an intertribal organization comprised of thirty-three (33) federally recognized Tribal Nations; and
WHEREAS,	the actions taken by the USET SPF Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member Tribal Nation, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member Tribal Nations' leadership; and
WHEREAS,	USET SPF is committed to the health and well-being of the youth of its Tribal Nation members; and
WHEREAS,	the Indian Health Service (IHS) Nashville Area Office currently operates the Unity Healing Center located in Cherokee, North Carolina as the Youth Regional Treatment Center (YRTC) for the IHS Nashville Area under section 708 of the Indian Health Care Improvement Act (IHCIA), 25 U.S.C. § 1665g; and
WHEREAS,	Section 708(b)(3) of the IHCIA, 25 U.S.C. § 1665g(b)(3), requires that a YRTC shall be located within an IHS Area at a location agreed upon by a majority of the Tribal Nations that will be served by the YRTC; and
WHEREAS,	a majority of the Tribal Nations within the IHS Nashville Area agreed through appropriate Tribal governmental resolutions and/or documentation, to locate the Unity Healing Center in Cherokee, North Carolina; and
WHEREAS,	the Unity Healing Center provides alcohol and substance abuse detoxification and treatment, including behavioral health services, for Native American youth at the YRTC for the IHS Nashville Area; and
WHEREAS,	Tribal Nations in the IHS Nashville Area believe that access and services at the Unity Healing Center would be significantly enhanced if managed by one or more Tribal Nations in the IHS Nashville Area utilizing the rights and benefits afforded under the Indian Self Determination Education and Assistance Act (ISDEAA); and
WHEREAS,	some Tribal Nations in the IHS Nashville Area have expressed an interest and willingness

WHEREAS, the USET SPF Board of Directors supports one or more Tribal Nations in the IHS Nashville Area, alone or jointly, assuming management of all PFSAs and funds associated with the

Unity Healing Center under authority of the ISDEAA; and

to contract all programs, functions, services, activities (PFSAs) and related funds for the

aforementioned PFSAs for the Unity Healing Center under the ISDEAA with support of a majority of Tribal Nations within the IHS Nashville Area; and

WHEREAS,

the USET SPF Board of Directors believes that if one or more Tribal Nations in the IHS Nashville Area contract for all PFSAs at the Unity Healing Center all Tribal Nations in the IHS Nashville Area will continue to have access to all PFSAs at the Unity Health Center to the same degree, if not greater access; and

WHEREAS.

the USET SPF Board of Directors believes that nothing in this resolution should prevent an eligible Tribal Nation in the IHS Nashville Area from taking its share of funds at the Unity Healing Center and assuming PFSAs related to those funds in an ISDEAA agreement, if the program is ever deemed divisible under the ISDEAA; and

WHEREAS,

in December 2010, the United States recognized the rights of its First Peoples through its support of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP), whose provisions and principles support and promote the purposes of this resolution; therefore, be it

RESOLVED

the USET SPF Board of Directors hereby supports legislation that will authorize having one or more Tribal Nations in the IHS Nashville Area, alone or jointly, assume the Program, Functions, Services and Activities and related funding of the Unity Healing Center under the Indian Self Determination Education and Assistance Act consistent with the support of a majority of the Tribal Nations within the Indian Health Service Nashville Area.
