USET Resolution No. 2012:011

SUPPORT OF LISTING THE AMERICAN EEL AS THREATENED UNDER THE ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT

WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprised of twenty-

six (26) federally recognized Tribes; and

WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member Tribe,

as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member Tribes' leadership; and

WHEREAS, the American eel (Anguilla rostrata) was a mainstay in the diets of the Passamaquoddy and Penobscot

Indians in Maine, the only state with commercial fishing for elvers and whose main market is overseas;

and

WHEREAS. American eels are a traditional source of food for the Passamaguoddy and Penobscot Tribes, are

culturally and spiritually important, and are an important link in the food chain of aquatic species, such as

striped bass and bluefish; and

WHEREAS, the population of American eels is in serious decline due to dams restricting their migration routes to

traditional freshwater habitat, pollution of rivers, and overfishing by the non-Indian population; and

WHEREAS, the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) has received a petition from the Council for

Endangered Species Act Reliability to extend federal protection to the American eel under the authority of

the Endangered Species Act of 1973, as amended (ESA); and

WHEREAS, the USFWS has initiated a 60 day status review period and is requesting information to help determine if

listing of the American eel as threatened under the ESA is warranted; therefore, be it

RESOLVED the USET Board of Directors supports the listing of the American eel as threatened under the Endangered

Species Act for reasons stated above, provided the threatened status does not interfere with Tribal

traditional use of same.
