USET Resolution No. 2011:028

REQUEST FOR AN INVESTIGATION ON THE DISCRIMINATION AGAINST THE AKWESASNE MOHAWKS

WHEREAS,	United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprised of
	twenty-six (26) federally recognized Tribes; and

WHEREAS,	the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each
·	member Tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member Tribes' leadership;
	and

WHEREAS,	the USET Board of Directors is working for the best interests of their Tribal Governments, and their
	members, to protect, promote, and enhance opportunities for their people; and

WHEREAS,	the St. Regis Mohawk Tribe is a federally recognized Tribal government located in the southern
	portion of Akwesasne, New York; and

WHEREAS,	it has been entrusted with the authority granted by the Tribal Membership and Leadership working
	with the United States Department of the Interior to accept and administer the issuance of Tribal
	government identification cards to its membership; and

WHEREAS,	Tribal identification cards are recognized by the U.S. Federal Government and is further
	recognized by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security as an acceptable border crossing
	identification card following the implementation of the Western Hemisphere Travel initiative; and

WHEREAS,	it is the position of the St. Regis Mohawk Tribe that Canada Border Services Agency has
	discriminated against Tribal members by not recognizing the St. Regis Mohawk Tribal identification
	cards; and

WHEREAS,	in recent times the U.S. and Canada have both passed legislation recognizing the rights of
	Indigenous Nations to determine their own identity and membership of the people they represent;
	therefore, be it

RESOLVED	the USET Board of Directors supports the St. Regis Mohawk Tribe in requesting the Canadian
	Human Rights Commission to investigate the prejudicial practices of the Canadian Border Service
	Agency in its dealings with the St Regis Mohawk of Akwesasne.
