USET Resolution No. 2011:046

SUPPORT OF NATIVE AMERICAN FULL PARTICIPATION IN THE SMALL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION 8(A) BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprised of twenty-six (26) federally recognized Tribes; and

WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member Tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member Tribes' leadership; and

WHEREAS, the United States Government has a unique legal and political relationship with American Indians/Alaska Natives, which is recognized in the U.S. Constitution, statutes, and Supreme Court decisions; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Congress has a legitimate interest in promoting the economic and political self-sufficiency of American Indian/Alaska Native as a way to fulfill the government's unique obligations towards American Indian/Alaska Native; and

whereas, providing access to federal contracting opportunities to qualified Native enterprises provides critical incentives that stimulate economic growth in American Indian/Alaska Native communities, provides economic opportunities for American Indian/Alaska Native enterprises, supports social services programs, and encourages entrepreneurship; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Congress has held many hearings that seek to address and redress the overwhelming poverty and unemployment experienced by American Indian/Alaska Native both on and off the reservations that arises from their historical relationship with the U.S. Government; and

WHEREAS, American Indian/Alaska Native communities suffer from the worst poverty in this country, with unemployment levels up to 75% and, because of the lack of resources, there are few individual entrepreneurs in Native communities; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Government buys more than \$500 billion in goods and services annually, and has a statutory goal of awarding at least 23% of its purchases to small and disadvantaged businesses; and

WHEREAS, in hundreds of treaties with Indian Tribes across the country, and through the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, the U.S. Government committed to provide for the economic betterment of American Indian/Alaska Native, the majority of whom have been stripped of countless millions of acres of their ancestral lands; and

whereas, one of the most successful federal initiatives has been to include American Indian/Alaska Native (including Alaska Native Corporations and Native Hawaiian Organizations) in the Small Business Administration (SBA) 8(a) Business Development Program; and

WHEREAS,
American Indian/Alaska Native enterprises have struggled to break into the highly concentrated federal contracting marketplace, which is dominated by a handful of large companies, and only recently have some American Indian/Alaska Native enterprises become successful participants in the 8(a) program; and

American Indian/Alaska Native owned enterprises receive just over 1% of all federal contract WHEREAS, awards compared to the five largest contractors who received 20% of all the contract dollars

awarded in 2007; and

American Indian/Alaska Native owned enterprises provide quality performance at cost efficient WHEREAS.

> rates to federal customers, while they return significant benefits back to American Indian/Alaska Native communities, rendering the Native 8(a) program a rare example of a federal economic

program that works; and

there have been ongoing efforts by some members of Congress to repeal or significantly modify WHEREAS,

the Native 8(a) program based on biased information, and without consideration of the U.S.

Government's unique obligations to American Indian/Alaska Native; and

American Indian/Alaska Native have only recently become successful participants in the 8(a) WHEREAS,

program and Native communities are just beginning to experience the benefits of the program; and

USET recognizes that participation of American Indian/Alaska Native in the SBA 8(a) program has WHEREAS.

been an important tool in building a strong Native economy and continues to provide substantial

benefits to American Indian/Alaska Native and Native Hawaiians; and

USET recognizes past contributions of Congress and the Administration to work positively with WHEREAS,

American Indian/Alaska Native to improve the 8(a) program for all participants and protect the

rights of American Indian/Alaska Native in the program; therefore, be it

RESOLVED the USET Board of Directors respectfully requests the continued support of the United States

Congress to maintain American Indian/Alaska Native -owned enterprises in the 8(a) program for

the benefit of all Native communities located in the United States; and, be it further

RESOLVED, the USET Board of Directors does hereby strongly encourage the Small Business Administration to

seek ways to promote and expand participation in the 8(a) program for AI/AN owned enterprises;

and, be it further

the USET Board of Directors does hereby urge the Administration to continue to consult with RESOLVED.

American Indian/Alaska Native on any changes to the 8(a) program that may affect our businesses

and communities pursuant to Executive Order 13175; and, be it further

the USET Board of Directors strongly opposes any Congressional amendments, regulatory RESOLVED,

changes or other means to diminish, alter, denounce, or abolish the current provisions established in the federal procurement system allowing American Indian/Alaska Native to create economic

development for the benefit of their respective Indian communities.
