Selected Competitive Grants Available to Communities, Tribes and Others

- Great Lakes Restoration Initiative (GLRI): Investing in Great Lakes resource protection by mitigating Emerald Ash Borer impacts, tree planting to reduce runoff, restoring coastal wetland vegetation, treating invasive species.
- Landscape Scale Restoration (LSR): grants to shape forest land use on a scale that optimizes public benefits from trees and forests (including urban forests). Proposals must be supported by state forester(s).
- Community Forest Program (CFP): funding to establish community forests that provide continuing and accessible community benefits.
