Thank you for your letter requesting tribal consultation regarding Maine's section 1115 demonstration project application. We appreciate you sharing your concerns with us.

We understand you are concerned about the lack of meaningful tribal consultation between the United South and Eastern Tribes Sovereignty Protection Fund and the state. We also acknowledge your concern that, unless certain exceptions are made for American Indians and Alaska Natives (AI/ANs) residing in Maine, the proposed demonstration would be inconsistent with existing federal legal protections for AI/ANs.

As you noted in your letter, tribal governments have a unique political relationship with the federal government. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) is committed to maintaining a government-to-government relationship with Indian tribes, as acknowledged in the CMS Tribal Consultation Policy.

Please know that CMS is committed to increasing access to care, eliminating health disparities experienced by American Indians in Maine and honoring the government-to-government relationship through tribal consultation. We will work with you to schedule tribal consultation and to discuss the issues raised in your letter.
