

# SPENDING BILL INCLUDES INCREASES FOR TRIBAL COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



## **Summary of the Spending Bill**

The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2018, <u>H.R. 1625</u>, which is the \$1.3 trillion spending bill that Congress passed on Friday, contains increases for tribal economic development and community initiatives. Also included is \$2.4B for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, an increase of \$203M compared to 2017, and \$914M for the Bureau of Indian Education, an increase of \$22M compared to 2017.
