## UNITED SOUTHEASTERN TRIBES, INC. Resolution USET 73-14

A Resolution Requesting Full Funding for the Indian Education Act of 1972

- WHEREAS, American Indian students have educational needs which cannot be met unless additional educational resources are channeled through local and Indian educational agencies, and
- WHEREAS, the United States Congress acknowledged these needs by passage of the Indian Education Act of 1972, Title IV of P. L. 92-318, which was signed into law by the President of the United States, and \$36 million dollars was the figure approved by the United States Senate to fund the Act for FY 1973, which figure was subsequently reduced to \$18 million dollars in conference with the House Committee, and
- WHEREAS, \$18 million dollars is not nearly enough to implement the Indian Education Act of 1972 and meet the educational needs of Indian students,
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the United Southeastern Tribes, Inc., does hereby request that the U.S. Senate and the U.S. House of Representatives take action to appropriate funds under this act for FY 1974 at the \$80 million dollar level.
