- WHEREAS: United Southeastern Tribes, Inc. has considered the plight of the Havasupai Tribe, who are being denied their lands and use of traditional neighboring lands for sacred and religious purposes, and
- WHEREAS: United Southeastern Tribes, Inc. is grievously concerned about the inroads being made throughout the entire United States against Native Americans' cultural, traditional and religious practices.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the member tribes of United Southeastern Tribes, Inc. unanimously endorse the request of the Havasupai for additional land.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that United Southeastern Tribes, Inc. Board of Directors willingly indicates this position by forwarding this resolution, and letters of concurrance from its member tribal councils, to the Havasupai people and members of concerned congressional and senate committees.
