- WHEREAS, the passage of the Indian Self-Determination and Educational Reform
  Act (S. 1017) is crucial to the further development of the policy
  of Indian Self-Determination encouraging tribal contracting which will
  strengthen Indian control of Indian programs and is crucial to the
  improvement of education for the Indian people, and
- WHEREAS, the United States Senate has passed this legislation and it is now being considered by the Indian Affairs Subcommittee of the House Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs, and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Affairs Subcommittee has been unable to obtain a quorum to consider this legislation, and
- WHEREAS, if this legislation is not passed and signed this session, the lengthy introduction and hearings process will have been to no avail and have to be repeated, and
- WHEREAS, the passage of this legislation be mandate to the BIA to move forward with the contracting process, while its delay would indicate to BIA that the Congress does not feel strongly about tribal contracting,
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that United Southeastern Tribes, Inc., urges the House Indian Affairs Subcommittee and the Congress as a whole to consider S. 1017 at the earliest possible date after the end of the election recess, and
- RESOLVED, further that the Executive Director of United Southeastern Tribes, Inc., to send this resolution to Representative Meede, the Chairman of the House Subcommittee on Indian Affairs, and other appropriate Congressional representatives.
