the United South and Eastern Tribes membership consists of the Coushatta Tribe of Louisiana, Chitimacha Tribe of Louisiana, Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, Miccosukee Tribe of Florida, Mississippi Band of Choctaws, Seminole Tribe of Florida, Seneca Nation of Indians of New York, St. Regis Band of Mahawks of New York, Passamaquoddy-Indian Township of Maine, Penobscot Nation of Maine, Passamaquoddy-Pleasant Point of Maine and Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians of Maine, as an Inter Tribal Council which was founded to benefit the Indian Tribes in the East. and

WHEREAS,

the Calumet Center is a project supported by the membership that will enchance the self sufficiency of the membership, and

WHEREAS,

the Member Benefit Fund has proven to be a valuable asset both in services and economic development to the membership, and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the United South and Eastern Tribes endores the submission of a proposal to the Administration for Native Americans that will support the expansion of the Member Benefit Fund and the Calumet Center, and

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the United South and Eastern Tribes authorized Rex Evans, Executive Director to submit the proposal to A.N.A. for funding.
