WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes, Inc. represents seventeen federally recognized tribes in the South and Eastern United States, and


WHEREAS, attainment of equal and excellent educational opportunities by American Indians is a top priority, and there are many educational issues facing Indian Tribes which require careful analysis and action by the entire body of United South and Eastern Tribes (USET); tribal educational programs will be enhanced by education specialists and interested individuals forming a committee to advise the USET Board, and


WHEREAS, on Dec 12-15, 1988, the education advisory committee representing 10 tribes in attendance at the USET meeting held in Miami, Florida are willing to serve as the Education Committee for USET, and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the USET Board formally recognize a standing Education Committee, which will be composed of at least one representative of each member tribe, to advise and make recommendations to the USET Board regarding specific Indian Education Issues.
