SUPPORT FOR INCREASED LEVELS OF INDIAN HOUSING UNITS, THE CREATION OF A ONE-YEAR COMMISSION ON INDIAN AND ALASKA NATIVE HOUSING, AND A HOUSING SYMPOSIUM

- whereas, the United States Senate Select Committee on Indian Affairs, by letter from Vice-Chairman John McCain, has expressed a sincere desire to seek support for a minimum of 3,000 units of new development for Indian housing for FY 90, and to establish a one year Commission on Indian and Alaska Native housing, charged with reviewing and recommending alternative funding sources; and
- WHEREAS, Senator McCain has initiated the development of a Housing Symposium to be held in Washington, DC, to create a forum for educating government entities and the Congress to gain a better understanding of the housing situation in Indian Country; and
- WHEREAS, interests of this nature from the Senate Select Committee in Indian Affairs is definitely in the best interest of USET's pursuit for housing all Indian and Alaska Native families,
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the USET Board of Directors vigorously and unanimously supports the efforts of the United States Senate Select Committee on Indian Affairs in pursuit of a minimum of 3,000 units of new development, establishment of the above referenced commission, and development of the Housing Symposium; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the need for minimum of 6,000 units per year of new development for Indian and Alaska Native housing is a significantly more realistic figure in attempting to address the critical shortage of Indian housing and the USET Board supports this minimum level of funding.
