SCHEDULING OF INDIAN CITIZEN HEARINGS ON HOUSING CONCERNS AT THE ANNUAL BOARD MEETING IN CHEROKEE, NORTH CAROLINA, OCTOBER 1990

- whereas, the United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of eighteen (18) federally-recognized tribes; and
- whereas, the actions taken by the USET, Inc. Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors is comprised of delegates from the member tribes leadership; and
- WHEREAS, USET, Inc. has established a Housing Committee comprising of representatives from their member Tribal Housing Authorities; and
- whereas, it is imperative that the voices of Indian Tribal Leadership and citizenry be heard in order to update and clarify the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Housing Needs Surveys and that they may be outdated and inaccurate; and
- whereas, these antiquated surveys and inaccuracies therein result in shortfalls in funding and a misconception in the actual need for housing for tribal members and their families in Indian Country.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the National American Indian Housing Council has secured funding to hold Indian Citizen Hearing Forums in order that this problem be corrected; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the USET Housing Committee requests the USET Board to schedule one of these hearings during one of the annual meetings for USET, specifically, at the Board Meeting scheduled for Cherokee, North Carolina, in October of 1990.
