
**JOINT USFWS/BIA NATIVE AMERICAN CONSERVATION
ENFORCEMENT TRAINING**

- WHEREAS,** the United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of twenty (20) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS,** the actions taken by the USET, Inc. Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member Tribe, as the Board of Directors is comprised of delegates from the member Tribe's leadership; and
- WHEREAS,** the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) currently trains Conservation Enforcement Officers for Federal Lands; and
- WHEREAS,** the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) currently trains Law Enforcement Officers for Federal Indian Reservations; and
- WHEREAS,** the USFWS is dedicated through the implementation of its National Indian Policy to provide technical assistance to the Tribes; and
- WHEREAS,** there is a need for Native American Conservation Enforcement Training for the USET member tribes and throughout Indian Country.


