- WHEREAS, the USET Board of Directors understands that the Catawba Indian Nation was terminated by act of Congress in 1959, has reviewed and discussed the attached Catawba Restoration Bill and supports this action to seek restoration of federal recognition for the Catawba Indian Nation.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the USET Board of Directors extends full support for the restoration of federal recognition of the Catawba Indian Nation; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of USET, Inc. is authorized to sign this resolution and the USET staff and member Tribes are further authorized to take such action as may be necessary to carry out the intent of this resolution.
