SUPPORT THE DEVELOPMENT OF A TEN YEAR GOAL TO ERADICATE SUBSTANDARD HOUSING CONDITIONS

- whereas, the United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of twenty (20) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET, Inc. Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors is comprised of delegates from the member tribes leadership; and
- WHEREAS, the health, safety, welfare, education, economic and employment opportunity, and preservation of cultural and natural resources are primary goals and objectives of USET; and
- WHEREAS, current housing conditions in American Indian and Alaska Native communities are often deplorable, with native people experiencing extreme overcrowding, and lack of safe drinking water and sanitation facilities; and
- WHEREAS, a long term comprehensive plan needs to be developed to address the housing needs in native areas on a continuing basis.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of USET hereby supports the position of the development of a ten year goal to eradicate substandard housing conditions in native areas, including the creation of a Native American Finance Authority.
