TRIBAL LEADERS TO RESOLVE THE ISSUE OF THE INDIRECT COST SHORTFALL BY REQUESTING FROM CONGRESS THE FULL AMOUNT

- whereas, the United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of twenty (20) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET, Inc. Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors is comprised of delegates from the member tribes leadership; and
- WHEREAS, Congress failed to appropriate to the Indian Health Service (IHS) 100% of contract support; and
- WHEREAS, the unmet need of Indirect Cost stands at \$1.4 million in the Nashville Area for fiscal year 1993; and
- WHEREAS, the Indirect Cost pool will show a shortfall for fiscal year 1994.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of USET hereby seek from Congress 100% of identified contract support cost needed for fiscal year 1993, totaling \$1.4 million as USET's portion of the total IHS shortfall, estimated to be \$24 million.
