## Resolution No. 93-05LA

## ESTABLISH A NETWORK FOR NATIVE LANGUAGE TEACHERS

- WHEREAS, the United South and Eastern Tribes, Inc. (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of twenty-one (21) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET, Inc. Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors is comprised of delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and
- WHEREAS, the USET Board of Directors is interested in establishing a network for Native American culture and language educators to promote, initiate and implement the exchange of language, curriculum programming; and
- WHEREAS, Native American languages are in jeopardy of extinction if Tribal Leaders, educators and community members do not take the initiative to promote the Tribal language the repercussions will entail extinction of the Native "spoken" languages; and
- WHEREAS, the 102nd Congress enacted the Native American Language Act of 1992, authorizing a program of grants to Tribal governments, to be administered by the Administration for Native Americans to help assure the survival and continuing vitality of Native American Languages; and
- WHEREAS, the USET Board recognized the importance of this resource in maintaining and perpetuating our Native Languages.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the USET Board of directors supports the establishment of a Native American Language Instructors network; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** the USET Board of Directors supports funding for the network to be sought from available sources.
