REQUEST THE SECRETARY OF INTERIOR TO PROVIDE ADEQUATE FUNDING FOR CONSERVATION LAW ENFORCEMENT

- WHEREAS, the United South and Eastern Tribes, Inc. (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of twenty-one (21) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET, Inc. Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors is comprised of delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and
- WHEREAS, USET in Resolution 92-06MS supported and encouraged both the US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) to develop and implement a Training Curriculum for Native American Conservation Enforcement Officers n Indian country; and
- WHEREAS, the USFWS and BIA did indeed develop with Tribal input the aforesaid training curriculum; and
- WHEREAS, the BIA is in the process of implementing the aforesaid training curriculum.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the USET Board of Directors does hereby request the Secretary of the Interior to provide adequate funding for the training of 24 Native American Conservation Law Enforcement Officers.
