**RESOLUTION NO. 93-06NC**

**SUPPORT THE DEVELOPMENT OF INDIAN HOUSING TO  
ERADICATE SUBSTANDARD HOUSING CONDITIONS**

- WHEREAS,** the United South and Eastern Tribes, Inc. (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of twenty (20) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS,** the actions taken by the USET, Inc. Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors is comprised of delegates from the member Tribes leadership; and
- WHEREAS,** the health, safety, welfare, education, economic and employment opportunity, and preservation of cultural and natural resources are primary goals and objectives of USET; and
- WHEREAS,** current housing conditions of American Indian and Alaska Native communities are deplorable, with native people experiencing extreme overcrowding, and lack of adequate housing and facilities in the state of Tennessee and Washington, DC area; and
- EAS,** housing for Indian families, the employees of many Indian Service Programs for all income levels does not exist without current advocacy by Non-Indian housing entities;


**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the USET Board hereby supports the position to eradicate substandard housing conditions in Tennessee and Washington, DC areas, including the creation of a USET Native American Finance Authority, USET Housing Division, and/or expand the current existing housing entities to ensure adequate housing for all Indians and Alaska Natives.
