RESOLUTION No. 11/94-22FL

INCLUSION OF NATIVE AMERICAN WITHIN HUD'S HOMELESS DEFINITION

- WHEREAS, The United South and Eastern Tribes (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of twenty-one (21) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors is comprised of delegates from the member tribes leadership; and
- WHEREAS, homelessness exists throughout Indian Country; and
- WHEREAS, in keeping with native traditions families assist homeless tribal members by offering temporary shelter that may be a one night or more from the weather which causes and increases overcrowded and substandard conditions throughout Indian country; and
- WHEREAS, many Indian Housing Authorities who have applied for Homeless funds have been denied, lacking HUD Homeless criteria within the HUD definition of "Homelessness."

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the United South and Eastern Tribes Board of Directors request that the definition of "homelessness" be redefined to address homelessness in Native American communities.
