Resolution No. USET 97:37

## REQUEST FOR INCREASED FUNDING

- WHEREAS, the United South and Eastern Tribes Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprised of twenty-three (23) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors is comprised of delegates from the member tribes leadership; and
- WHEREAS, Congress has instructed the National Park Service to administer the Historic Preservation Grants; and
- WHEREAS, in 1992 Congress made it possible for American Indian Tribes to assume the responsibilities of State Historic Preservation Offices; and
- WHEREAS, no funds have been appropriated by Congress for this purpose; and
- WHEREAS, the funds for the Historic Preservation Grants have had to be split between those tribes assuming historic preservation office responsibilities and those applying for special projects; therefore, be it
- **RESOLVED**, that the USET Board of Directors requests that funding for the Historic Preservation Grant be increased and that the funds that are annually appropriated to states for their state historic preservation offices also be appropriated annually to those tribes who have assumed for themselves the duties of Historic Preservation as they are to the State.
