## Resolution No. USET 99:28

## PROVIDING DIRECT ACCESS TO TITLE IV-E FOSTER CARE FUNDING FOR TRIBAL GOVERNMENTS

- WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprising twenty-three (23) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and
- WHEREAS, Title IV-E of the Social Security Act has provided entitlement funding for foster care services since 1981; and
- WHEREAS, Title IV-E funding is currently available to only state agencies and the programs with which the state has formed agreements; and
- WHEREAS, Tribal children who are placed by tribal courts or other tribal agencies are not eligible to receive IV-E entitlement funds; and
- WHEREAS, the Title IV-E program was designed to serve all eligible children in the United States, regardless of location or jurisdiction; and
- WHEREAS, tribal governments have some of the greatest needs for foster care services of any governments; therefore, be it
- **RESOLVED** the USET Board of Directors supports the passage of federal legislation that would amend Title IV-E and give tribal governments full access to the Title IV-E funds, including, but not limited to foster care maintenance payments, administration, training, information systems development and adoption assistance.
