Resolution No. USET 2000:05

TRIBAL COLLECTION OF STATE TAXES

- WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprising twenty-three (23) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and
- WHEREAS, the House Resources Committee held a hearing on October 12, 1999 regarding the issue of tribal collection of state transaction taxes, an issue that has received increased attention in the past couple of years; and
- WHEREAS, Representatives Visclosky, Istook, and Sandlin, co-sponsors of H.R. 1814, advised the Committee that a legislative solution to loss of state revenue as a result of "tribal tax evasion" is necessary; and
- WHEREAS, the Economic Development Committee considers this legislative solution as an "Impairment to Nation-to-Nation Trade"; therefore, be it
- **RESOLVED**, that the USET Board of Directors recommends that USET member tribes advocate against the tribal collection of state taxes.
