Resolution No. USET 2000:17

NHPA SECTION 106 CONSULTING PARTY

- WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprising twenty-three (23) federally recognized tribes; and
- **WHEREAS,** the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and
- WHEREAS, the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP) has published the Implementation of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (Final Regulations); and
- **WHEREAS,** the Constitution of the United States of American recognizes only three forms of government, federal, state and tribal; and
- WHEREAS, Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (Final Regulations) has certain sections within the final regulations which by their very wording diminishes tribal sovereignty; and
- WHEREAS, the failure of the regulations to grant signatory authority like that given State
 Historic Preservation Offices further defines a lessened role in preservation and
 protection of those properties and entities most critical to American Indian culture
 and heritage, therefore be it
- **RESOLVED** that the USET Board of Directors objects to these changes which give any "interested party" the status of being a consulting party, thereby granting them equal status with a Sovereign Indian Nation and; therefore be it further
- **RESOLVED** that the USET Board of Directors supports and recommends that the "consulting parties" language is specific to federally recognized Indian tribes.
