## ENFORCEMENT OF EASTERN TRIBAL COLLEGE INITIATIVE

- WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprising twenty-three (23) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and
- WHEREAS, the USET Education Committee, through the USET Board of Directors, is charged with advising member tribal governments on Federal Indian Education Programs; and
- WHEREAS, the USET Education Committee was established to promote and develop direction in Indian Education; and
- WHEREAS, the delegates to the USET Education Committee have agreed that higher education opportunities need to be expanded; and
- WHEREAS, there are no Native American Institutions for Higher Education east of the Mississippi; therefore, be it
- **RESOLVED** that the USET Board of Directors endorses the USET Education Committee's initiative to develop an Eastern Tribal College; be it further
- **RESOLVED** that the USET Board of Directors supports the USET Education Committee in the gathering of the information necessary to prepare a proposal for submission to the USET Board during the 2000 Impact Week Meeting.
