USET Resolution No. 2000:75

OPPOSITION TO THE ONE-YEAR MORATORIUM PROPOSED IN THE FY 2001 INTERIOR APPROPRIATIONS BILL

- WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprising twenty-four (24) federally recognized tribes; and
- **WHEREAS,** the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and
- WHEREAS, the House Interior Subcommittee has proposed another one-year moratorium on new and/or expanded contracts/compacts as a rider to FY 2001 budget for Interior and related agencies; and
- WHEREAS, since 1975, the fundamental policy of Congress with respect to American Indian/Alaska Native (AI/AN) Tribal Governments has been to encourage the policy of self-determination and self-governance; therefore, be it
- **RESOLVED** to allow all AI/AN Tribal Governments to continue to exercise their sovereign right to enter into new and/or expanded contracts/compacts under P.L. 93-638, the USET Board of Directors is in opposition of the bill language that proposes a one-year moratorium in the FY 2001 budget process of the Interior Appropriations bill.
