USET Resolution No. 2000:80

WIRELESS COMMUNICATION TOWER PERMITTING

- WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprising twenty-three (24) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and
- WHEREAS, there is a proliferation nationwide in the expansion of wireless communication systems, particularly in construction of "cellular telephone" towers; and
- WHEREAS, federal permits are required for such undertakings as may affect historic properties or traditional cultural, religious and/or sacred sites related to, or of importance to, a federally recognized Tribe may be affected; and
- WHEREAS, the significant and growing number of such inquiries from these companies and/or their agents, requesting information applicable to these concerns and which require extensive research in order to make competent reply has placed undue staffing and economic burdens upon the Tribes and their Preservation Offices; therefore, be it
- **RESOLVED** that the USET Board of Directors hereby adopt the attached standard response form and encourages the USET member tribes to employ and adhere to it as a standard, in order to demonstrate our strength in unity.

| Due to the historic presence of theTribe and their ancestors in the area under consideration, there is a strong likelihood of such sites being present at this location. |
| Since the issuance of a permit by a federal agency is an Undertaking under the National Historical Preservation Act (NHPA) we, therefore, require that a cultural resource management (CRM) survey be conducted by a Registered Professional Archaeologist in full compliance with Section 106 of the NHPA. |
| Upon receipt of this report, we will review it and make a determination of the appropriate response required by this request. It may also be necessary for a site visit to occur, either before or after the CRM survey is conducted, before such a determination can be made by theTribe. |
| The fee for this initial review will be \$ Subsequent costs and the expense of any necessary site visit, including all travel costs, are expected to be borne by you and/or your client. |
| While the State Historic Preservation Officer is required by the NHPA to respond to requests such as yours within 30 days, Federally Recognized sovereign Indian Tribes are under no such obligation. |
| We additionally require appropriate notice of any action in this review process which may affect our legal and statutory interests in this location. |
