USET Resolution No. 2001:059

## RELOCATION OF THE BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS' EASTERN REGIONAL OFFICE OF INDIAN EDUCATION AND OFFICE OF LAW ENFORCEMENT

- WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of twenty-four (24) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and
- WHEREAS, the USET Board of Directors passed Resolution 2000:58, calling for the relocation of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Eastern Regional Office (ERO), to the Calumet Building in Nashville, TN, for various reasons important and beneficial to all USET member Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, it is known by the USET Board of Directors that two offices, currently located within ERO, Indian Education and Law Enforcement are not moving to Nashville, TN, thus undermining the spirit and intent of USET Resolution 2000:58; and
- WHEREAS, it is known by the USET Board of Directors that the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, or in the absence of this position, Deputy Commissioner has supervision and line authority over these two offices; therefore, be it
- **RESOLVED** that the USET Board of Directors objects to the exclusion of the Office of Indian Education and Office of Law Enforcement in the ERO relocation to Nashville, TN, and that this position be conveyed to the Deputy Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

## CERTIFICATION
