## USET Resolution No. 2001:065

## SUPPORT OF A MINIMUM BUFFER ZONE

- WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of twenty-four (24) federally recognized Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member Tribes' leadership; and
- WHEREAS, the protection of human remains, associated grave goods, sacred sites, and historic properties are of critical importance to the USET member Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the encroachments of development are so constant as to pose a continuous threat to these sites; and
- WHEREAS, the determination of the physical parameters of such sites has been made almost entirely by archaeologists and others not representing the cultural concerns of the Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, it is the position of USET that the protection of such sites requires the establishment of standardized site buffer zones, in order to protect the physical and visual integrity of such sites; therefore, be it
- **RESOLVED** that USET considers that a buffer of 35 meters constitutes the minimum distance necessary to maintain the integrity of a cultural site; and, therefore, be it further
- **RESOLVED** that this distance should be established as a radius measured from the outside perimeter of the site, as defined by standard archaeological procedures.

## CERTIFICATION

This resolution was duly passed at the USET Semi-Annual Meeting, at which a quorum was present in Marksville, LA, on Thursday, May 24, 2001.
