USET Resolution No. 2001:066

TEA-21/IRR NEGOTIATED RULEMAKING

- WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an inter-tribal organization comprised of twenty-four (24) federally recognized Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member Tribes' leadership; and
- WHEREAS, the construction of roads on or near an American Indian Reservation or Tribal lands and dependent Indian communities has the potential to affect Tribal cultural resources in a Tribe's ancestral geographic area; and
- WHEREAS, there are significant monies appropriated by the US Department of Transportation and Federal Highways Administration for the purposes of planning, obligations, review, and compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), as these relate to road construction and historic preservation; and
- WHEREAS, the negotiated rulemaking process relating to the Transportation Efficiency Act and the Indian Reservation Roads Program (TEA-21/IRR) has not addressed or included rulemaking for NEPA or NHPA compliance to date; therefore, be it
- **RESOLVED** that the USET Board of Directors requests that negotiated rulemaking on TEA-21/IRR be expanded to include historic preservation compliance issues and funding, as they relate to planning, review, and protection of cultural resources.
