## THE SET-ASIDE FUNDING FOR REMEDIATION OF BLACK MOLD

WHEREAS,	United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization
	comprised of twenty-four (24) federally recognized tribes, and

the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and
icadership, and

WHEREAS,	USET recognizes that black mold is a serious problem in Indian Country with dangerous
	associated risks; and

WHEREAS,	the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act of 1996 funding fails
	to meet the needs of Indian Housing to combat the black mold problems; and

WHEREAS,	local/state government public housing agencies are receiving additional U. S. Department
	of Housing and Urban Development funding to address this issue; therefore, be it

RESOLVED	that the USET Board of Directors urges the 108th Congress to set aside \$100 million
	dollars for remediation of black mold in Indian Country.
