
USET Resolution No. 2003:072

THE SET-ASIDE FUNDING FOR REMEDIATION OF BLACK MOLD

- WHEREAS,** United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprised of twenty-four (24) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS,** the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and
- WHEREAS,** USET recognizes that black mold is a serious problem in Indian Country with dangerous associated risks; and
- WHEREAS,** the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act of 1996 funding fails to meet the needs of Indian Housing to combat the black mold problems; and
- WHEREAS,** local/state government public housing agencies are receiving additional U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development funding to address this issue; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED** that the USET Board of Directors urges the 108th Congress to set aside \$100 million dollars for remediation of black mold in Indian Country.
