USET Resolution No. 2004:027

REQUEST FOR MODIFICATON IN THE REGULATIONS TO ALLOW FOR TRIBAL PARTICIPATION IN **COMPETITIVE PUBLIC GRANTS TO ALLEVIATE HOMELESSNESS**

WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprised of twenty-four (24) federally recognized tribes; and

the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each WHEREAS, member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and

WHEREAS, USET Tribes were able to participate in programs to specifically address homelessness through public housing prior to the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act (NAHASDA); and

NAHASDA specifically does not include homelessness as a continually funded activity; WHEREAS,

WHEREAS, homelessness remains a significant problem among all USET member tribes; and

WHEREAS, current funding for homelessness available through public housing restricts the participation of Indian Tribes; therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the USET Board of Directors recommends that language of such programs be modified to include the participation of Indian Tribes.
